

What about the essay?

The topic—**Effects of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder on the individual and family members.**

- Minimum of 1,000 words
- Judged on content, appearance, grammar, originality, and punctuation.
- Type double-spaces essays only.
- The title page and the bibliography are not included in the 1000 words.
- Each essay must reflect the applicant's own research, writing and original thinking.
- The Internet or World Wide Web should not be the only source for your essay. Be aware that you may encounter "republished" or "third generation" information on the Internet that is inaccurate or improperly attributed. When citing Internet sources, you must include the following information: author(s), title of work, Internet address and date information was accessed. Internet sources should be listed separately from non-electronic sources, such as books, magazines and newspapers. Your essay must not rely solely on Internet research.
- Each essay must include a title page, not considered text, with the following information: essay title, author's name and date. The title of the essay, but **NOT** the author's name, **MUST** appear on the top of the first page of the essay text.
- A bibliography with references must be included and clearly identified.
- Suggestions:
 - Briefly define Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.
 - Set the discussion as a newspaper article.
 - Base your discussion with one or two actual Vietnam Veterans and family members who were affected by Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.
 - The following actual Vietnam Veterans had direct knowledge of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and its significance.
 - Buster Newberry
 - Johnny Garrard
 - Gary Heeter
 - Joe Schreiber
 - Myron Peterson
 - Charlie Morris
 - May also use your affected family members and friends, etc.
 - May present your discussion as "then and now" view points.
 - Put yourself in their shoes.
